THEME

The main objective of the seminar is to offer master's students from the School of Architecture the opportunity to engage with the themes of sustainability and ecological transition, through an integrated, interdisciplinary and multiscalar approach to urban planning and design. The starting reference point is the New Urban Agenda adopted by the UN conference on "Housing and Sustainable Urban Development" (Habitat III) in Quito, Ecuador, in October 2016. Students will be called to reflect on how the "sustainability paradigm" must be adapted, taking into account, on one hand, contributions from various expert fields, and on the other hand, the specific characteristics of local contexts, which are very different in the countries of the Global North and South. The seminar includes the contribution of professors from the Pontificia Universidad Católica del Ecuador (PUCE), with which DIDA established a scientific collaboration agreement in 2023.
